## A THANKSGIVING TRADITION


We all have our Thanksgiving traditions. They may include hunting, football, passing down grandma's homemade dressing recipe, eating too much pie, or some combination of all of the above. In Fitchburg, for the past 20 years, the tradition has been the Berbee Derby; a 5K, 10K and kids run on Thanksgiving morning.

The Berbee Derby was started by Jim Berbee as a way to raise money to help the community. 100% of the proceeds from the annual race went to the Technology Education Foundation (TEF), a non-profit focused on closing the "technology gap" for children, teens, and adults in Dane County. According to their Website, the TEF has granted in excess of \$1.5M to support technology education.

Following the close of the 2023 Berbee Derby, Tri 4 Schools took over production of the race with a little re-branding, but with the same core mission of donating 100% of the proceeds back to the community.

The <u>2024 Birdie Derby</u> will be the continuation of this funfilled, family-friendly, community event with the proceeds being used to "support kids, their families, and schools."

If you're not already scheduled to work this or another Thanksgiving morning race, we encourage you to sign up to run or walk as a participant (NOTE: festive costumes are highly encouraged) or as a <u>volunteer</u>. You can earn that extra piece of pie or turkey leg while spending the morning with some of the coolest and most fun people in Dane County.

# RECIPE CORNER

### **NO-BAKE CHOCOLATE OAT BARS**

Expected to bring a dessert this Thanksgiving?
Want something sweet that's *not* pumpkin spice?
Try these quick bars! They have oats, so they're healthy, right??

### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1C butter
- 1/2 C packed brown sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 3 C quick cooking oats
- 1 C semisweet chocolate chips
- 1/2 C peanut butter



### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Grease 9" square pan.
- 2.Melt butter in a large saucepan. Stir in brown sugar & vanilla; mix in oats. Cook over low heat, 2-3 minutes.
- 3. Press 1/2 of oat mixture into bottom of pan.
- 4. Melt chips & peanut butter over low heat, stirring until smooth. Pour over the oat layer in the pan and spread evenly.
- 5.Crumble remaining oat mixture on top, pressing down lightly. Cover & refrigerate at least 2-3 hours.


